LORRAINE HUGHES Ladies American Skeet World Champion

The home of American skeet shooting is the World Shooting complex at San Antonio in Texas, USA where every September contestants arrive from all over the world to compete for success over an intense 8 days of fierce competition.

This year saw the entries close at a massive 880 competitors including 20 or so Australians and a similar number of New Zealanders.

Australians Lorraine and Nigel Hughes from Caboolture Clay Target Club in Brisbane were competing for both individual titles as well as for the coveted husband and wife honours.

On only the second day of the main competition Lorraine won the 12 gauge Ladies World Champion for 2013, becoming the first Australian lady to ever do so and the pinnacle of her shooting career so far.

Lorraine was amongst those competitors to shoot a qualifying score of 149/150 to secure her place alongside the world's best in the shoot-off, these were held in the evening under lights and it is

here that Lorraine went into battle against the world's best and most experienced lady skeet shooters.

Without showing a glimmer of nerves her steely determination saw her hit pair after pair of targets with her fellow finalists falling along the way as one after another they missed.

On what was to become the final pair of the event Lorraine convincingly demolished both her targets with ease leaving only one competitor to shoot her own pair to draw level, this final competitor hit her first target but missed her second one immediately making Lorraine the first ever

Australian lady to win a world championship for American skeet much the vocal delight of the supporting Australian and New Zealanders in the crowd.

This is Lorraine's highest achievement to date and adds the title of 'World Champion' to her growing list of skeet shooting awards including being the first lady to qualify for the Glenn trophy team who recently successfully represented Australia in the New Zealand Nationals recently held in Christchurch.

2013 was the travelling year for the Australian Skeet team who headed to Christchurch, New Zealand to shoot for the auspicious Glenn Trophy.

The New Zealand team was made up of Steven Cooper, Tony Truss, Jamie Peryer-Fursdon, Dean Everett and Kelvin Gutsell.
