
2014 World Skeet Championships

SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS



What a successful trip it was for the Aussie Five Man Zone team of Paul Johnston, Barry Moss, Shane O'Brien, David O'Sullivan and Glenn Walker. After we tied with the Americans on 742/750, the Aussie team went on to win the shoot-off and the Championship. What a satisfying win it was! All team members arrived, safe and sound in San Antonio Texas, some days before the start of the Mini World events which, these days is the second biggest shoot in the USA. (Our equivalent back here would be the prenationals event).

The Mini World is a five gun event shot over three days as follows: Friday -100 target doubles;

Saturday – 100 target 12g in the morning followed by 100 target 28g in the afternoon; and

Sunday - 100 target 20g in the morning followed by 100 target .410 in the afternoon.

The High Over All (HOA) result is decided over the four standard gun events. The 12g, 20g, 28g and the .410 events giving a possible of 400 targets. While the High All Around (HAA) result adds the doubles for a possible of 500.

After getting over the jet lag, we quickly settled down and knuckled down to get a few targets under our belt. Apart from some heavy rain for the 12g event on Saturday morning of the Mini the weather remained quite good for the remainder of the Championships.

Monday - 100 Target doubles;

Tuesday – 150 target 12g (shot 75 in the morning and 75 in the afternoon);

Wednesday - 100 20g;

Thursday - 100 28g; and

Friday - 100 .410.

The HOA = 450 targets and the HAA=550 targets.

Each team member performed at his best and we came up with a score of 742 which tied with an American Zone team. Our team won the shoot-off and became the 2014 Zone Team Champions.

The smile on everyone's face after our shoot-off spoke volumes for the significance of our win. The knowledge and experience gained by each team member will filter through to our Australian skeet shooters who will now be encouraged by our success.

Paul Johnston, the Team Manager, is extremely proud of the team who, together with all the Australian shooters, conducted themselves as great ambassadors of our sport and Country. The Australian contingent was over twenty with about ten from New Zealand. During the Championships it was gratifying to see the Australian flag flying over the stadium together the flags of so many other nations.

The friendliness and hospitality of everyone we met was sensational. We were welcomed by the new skeet Director, Mike Dowling, who kindly accepted and acknowledged the plaque presented on behalf of the Australian Clay Target Association.

This is truly the best skeet shoot in the World. Anyone who loves skeet shooting and/or wants to represent our country at the World Shoot should have a go at making the team for 2016. The selections start after the 2015 Skeet Nationals. Otherwise just plan to go – you will not regret it!
