### **Masters Award**

This year was the continuation of the Skeet Masters awards and medals were presented to the 20 gauge qualifiers. The Master awards are presented to shooters who have achieved double the breaks required to win a Grand Slam award, that is, in the 20 gauge the score needed is a 200 break.

### All Skeet Masters Award

The last award of the evening was the All Skeet Masters Award which is for the Skeet shooter who has completed all legs of the Master's category, scoring masters breaks in all categories. 12 Gauge is a score of 400 x 400; 20 Gauge 200 x 200; Skeet Doubles 200 x 200.

This inaugural All Skeet Masters was presented to Michael Buttigieg of Victoria.

# 2021 Skeet Hall of Fame Inductee Michael Buttigieg

Michael Buttigieg first started shooting and hunting with friends in the USA and graduated to clay target shooting in the USA by shooting at the Thunder Mountain Public Range in Upstate New Jersey. Relocating to Australia, Michael did not shoot for several years until he got himself and his family established in Australia. Michael joined the Frankston Gun Club and started out shooting a

Lanber hunting shotgun he purchased from Mialls Gun Shop. Michael shot his first State titles in Victoria in 2011, coming runner up in the 12 gauge event. With a new Browning, Michael started to compete in many ACTA competitions and he started having success winning the 28 gauge Peter Vella Trophy at the NSW State Carnival in 2012 and then winning the Tasmanian 12 gauge State title in October 2012.

2013 saw Michael post some incredible achievements. Michael came runner-up in the National 20 gauge event and then proceeded to win the 2013 Australian National High Gun event. Michael then travelled to New Zealand in November 2013 and did exactly the same. He came runner-up in the 20 gauge event and won the NZ High Gun after shoot-offs with some very experienced shooters. Michael was the first skeet

shooter in modern times to win both Skeet High Guns in the same year.

By the end of 2014 Michael had won a total of 6 National titles 3 x National runner-ups and

8 State titles and had amassed enough Hall of Fame points to qualify (210) for the Skeet Hall of Fame after only competing for 3 years.

2017 saw Michael post some amazing results, the





first beating Adrian Cousens Skeet Long Break of 565 with a new Long Break of 783 straight in the 12 gauge. Michael joined a very elite few with a Skeet long run over 500 straight, only achieved by Adrian Cousens and David O'Sullivan.

It was David and Craig O'Neill from Queensland who Michael shot against in various national events that pushed him to achieve his long run out to 783. Michael of course won the High Gun in 2017. To top that off Michael also ran a 225 straight in Skeet Doubles at Bairnsdale and set the new Australian record for Skeet Doubles.

2018 saw Michael represent Australia at the World Skeet Championships in San Antonio, USA. Michael shot the 150 x 150 clean in the 12 gauge event and shot off with the current stars of the skeet game in the USA, being LP Giambrione and Mike Schmitt in the stadium field for a third place overall in the World 12 gauge event at his first World shoot! Michael also shot a 545/550 and finished in the top 10 worldwide in the World Shoot HOA.

Michael is a dedicated family man and his wife Mary Buttigieg also spoke at the Hall of Fame

dinner about Michael, the man off the skeet field. Michael is very much enjoying the next chapter in shooting Skeet with his son Francesco, who this year, shot his first Skeet Nationals, and is enjoying his son's Skeet journey.

I think that there may be more than one Buttigieg in the winner's circle in years to come!

At the time of his induction Michael has amassed 660 Hall of Fame points in his 10-year shooting career. 18 National titles, 10 National runners-up,

47 State titles, 7 x All Australian Teams, 5 X Glenn Trophy Teams, 7 x Trans-Tasman Teams, 1 x World Team, 11 x Victorian Postal Teams, 8 x Victorian Shoulder to Shoulder Teams, Long Break record holder 12 gauge 783, Long Break record holder Skeet Doubles 225, Long Break record holder 410 bore 125, AA Elite Number 25, Grand Slam 2015, 2 x Adrian Cousens Medals, inducted into Australian Hall of Fame 2021.

Michael is truly deserving of his induction to the 2021 Skeet Hall of Fame.
